## 2010/2011 Holiday Sanitation Services Schedule

The City of Fort Lauderdale provides sanitation service every day of the year except Christmas Day, December 25. The following information outlines the City's sanitation schedule for the 2010/2011 holiday season.

### THANKSGIVING DAY

There will be no changes to any City of Fort Lauderdale sanitation services, (e.g., garbage, bulk trash, yard waste and recycling collection) for Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, November 25, 2010.

### CHRISTMAS DAY

#### GARBAGE

There will be no garbage collection on Christmas Day, Saturday, December 25. Garbage collection for residents whose regular pickup schedule is Saturday will receive service on Wednesday, December 29, 2010.

#### BULK TRASH PICK UP

There will be no changes to the Bulk Trash collection schedule this holiday season.

#### YARD WASTE COLLECTION

There will be no yard waste collection on Christmas Day, Saturday, December 25. Yard waste collection service will resume on the next regularly scheduled pick up date, which is Wednesday, December 29, 2010.

#### RECYCLING

There will be no recycling collection on Christmas Day, Saturday, December 25. Recycling service will resume on the next regularly scheduled pick up date, which is Wednesday, December 29, 2010.

### NEW YEAR'S DAY

There will be no changes to any City of Fort Lauderdale sanitation services, (e.g., garbage, bulk trash, yard waste and recycling collection) for New Year's Day, Saturday, January 1, 2011.

## City's Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event Set for January 23, 2011

City of Fort Lauderdale and Broward County residents are invited to safely dispose of their household hazardous waste and electronics on Sunday, January 23, 2011 at the Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Event. The one-day event will take place from 8a to 3p at 101 N. Andrews Avenue, just west of City Hall in Fort Lauderdale.

With proof of residency, residents can drop off hazardous household items and electronics at no charge. Business or government generated waste will not be accepted.

### Acceptable items:

Items that will be accepted include: paint, paint thinners and strippers, gas cylinders, pesticides, insecticides, antifreeze, fluorescent light bulbs, automobile, mercury and rechargeable batteries, used motor oil, automotive fluids and gasoline solvents, fire extinguishers, flares, propane tanks, car batteries, lawn and pool chemicals and household cleaners.

Residents may also bring old electronics such as computers with accessories, televisions, fax machines, printers and cell phones for free disposal. To dispose of business-generated electronics, please call 954.577.4160.

### Unacceptable items:

Items that are not accepted include: explosive materials, biohazardous (medical) waste, microwaves, stereos or business-generated items will not be accepted at the event.

### Safety Precautions for Household Hazards Waste Items:

- Wear protective gloves.
- Do not mix products.
- Keep all items in their original containers with the lids tightly sealed. If the items are not in their original containers, residents should clearly label each item to identify the contents inside.
- Put leaking products in a large plastic container and use a non-flammable absorbent, such as cat litter, to pack around leaking products.
- Do not smoke or place products near sources of heat.

### Alternative Household Hazardous Waste Drop Off Locations:

For residents who are unable to attend the January 23rd event, items may be dropped off free of charge with proof of residency at one of the following Broward County collection sites:

#### North Area (Pompano)

2780 N. Powerline Road (North of Copans Road on the east side)

Hours of Operation: Every Friday and Saturday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Central Area (Davie)

5490 Reese Road (At I-595 and Davie Road, go east on Reese Road)

Hours of Operation: Every Saturday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

South Area (West Park)

5601 W. Hallandale Beach Blvd. (West of I-95 on the north side)

Hours of Operation: Every Friday and Saturday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event, which is co-sponsored by the City of Fort Lauderdale, Broward County Waste and Recycling Services and Partner Cities, was created to bring hazardous waste disposal services into the community and to provide an additional drop off location for county residents. By offering alternatives for the safe disposal of HHW, the City of Fort Lauderdale, Broward County and surrounding cities, are taking a pro-active role in protecting the environment and preventing these items from ending up in landfills or contaminating water sources and wastewater treatment plants.

## Fort Lauderdale Offers First Medication Take Back Event

Fort Lauderdale residents who are cleaning out their garages, sheds and homes to gather items for drop off at the City's annual Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Event can add one more place to check for item: their medicine cabinets.

As part of its annual Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Event, the City of Fort Lauderdale is sponsoring its first Medication Take Back Event. In addition to collecting HHW, the City will also be accepting unused, unwanted or expired medications. There is no cost to drop off medications and residents may remain anonymous; however, residents dropping off HHW will be required to provide proof of residency.

If you have medications you no longer need or want, this is a great opportunity to safely dispose of them. By properly disposing of medications at the Take Back event you will help:

- Prevent prescription drug abuse
- Prevent accidental overdoses
- Prevent accidental poisoning of children and pets
- Reduce environmental pollution
- Decrease the amount of waste sent to local landfills
- Protect our drinking water supply, local waterways and native wildlife

The Medication Take Back Event will be held the same day as the HHW event, which is Sunday, January 23, 2011 from 8a to 3p at 101 N. Andrews Avenue, just west of City Hall in Fort Lauderdale.

Start checking your medicine cabinet today for items to drop off at the Take Back event. Your participation in the event can help keep everyone safe – you, your family, friends, pets and your planet.

### **What to Bring**

- Medicated syrups, liquids, ointments, creams, shampoos, and lotions
- Medication samples
- Medications with incomplete or missing labels
- Over-the-counter medications
- Pet medication
- Prescription medications (controlled and non-controlled)
- Prescription inhalers
- Unknown tablets and capsules
- Vitamins

### **What not to bring:**

- Aerosol cans
- Bandages
- Chemotherapy/radioactive substances
- Injectable solutions
- Medical waste of any type
- Medications generated from businesses /doctor's offices
- Needles/sharps
- Syringes
- Thermometers (These items may be disposed of at the HHW drop off the same day.)

### **Helpful Guidelines**

- Leave all medications in their original containers with the name of each medicine visible if the labels are still intact.
- Remove all patient information (patient's name, doctor's name and prescription number) or black it out with a permanent marker.
- Make sure containers do not leak. Tighten the lids or place the medication in a plastic baggie if it is leaking.

City of Fort Lauderdale staff, along with a Fort Lauderdale police officer, will be on site to collect the medications. Once collected, the medications will be disposed of and destroyed in a safe, environmentally friendly manner according to state laws and regulations.

## Museum of Art | Fort Lauderdale To Showcase Pop Artist

*Charles Fazzino's Exhibit Entitled "Faces of Fort Lauderdale"*

*Dec. 9, 2010-Jan. 9, 2011*

### Fazzino's Museum Exhibition To Kickoff City Of Fort Lauderdale's Centennial Celebration

The Museum of Art | Fort Lauderdale will showcase 3-D Pop Artist Charles Fazzino's exhibit entitled "Faces of Fort Lauderdale" from Dec. 10, 2010 -Jan. 6, 2011. The exhibition celebrates the 2011 City of Fort Lauderdale Centennial Celebration and Charles Fazzino's role as the Official Centennial Artist.

Charles Fazzino has become well known for the frenetic energy, bright colors, and great detail that infuse his enormously popular 3-D work. The "Faces of Fort Lauderdale" exhibit will feature his 3-D painting entitled "Ten Decades of Fort Lauderdale" that was commissioned by the Centennial Committee to commemorate the City's one-hundredth anniversary. A Limited-Edition 3-D print and also Poster will available for purchase in the Museum Book Store/Café during the exhibition.

The exhibition will also include Charles Fazzino's most recent work, which both captures and celebrates the history of Fort Lauderdale.

"Trash Can History" – A sculpture that boldly illustrates the tone of the 1950s, expressed through discarded items hastily left in a beach trash receptacle in the face of an oncoming hurricane.

"The Fort Lauderdale Strip" – A large-scale sculptural relief representing Fort Lauderdale Beach during the 1980s.

“Drive-In Fort Lauderdale” – A large-scale sculptural relief representing a drive-in movie theatre in 1960s Fort Lauderdale.

“Fort Lauderdale Today” – A large, three-dimensional sculptured canvas acrylic painting representing present-day Fort Lauderdale.

“Faces of Fort Lauderdale” – A collection of 10 multi-layered, Plexiglas sculptures that tell the story of everyday people, decade-by-decade, who made Fort Lauderdale what it is today. Among the featured characters are a Seminole Indian, a Cuban immigrant, a real estate developer, a navy woman who lost her fiancé in the Bermuda Triangle, a famous black jazz musician, a college girl from up north on spring break, a Jewish retiree from New York, a gay nightclub dancer, an Italian-American business entrepreneur, and a transplanted motorcycle dude/tattoo parlor shop owner.



## About Charles Fazzino

Fazzino is the official artist for the upcoming Winterfest Boat Parade as well as Super Bowl XLV. Fazzino is currently working on completing his permanent installation at the American Airlines terminal at JFK International Airport. During his 30-year career, he has become acclaimed throughout the US, Europe and Asia for his 3-D pop art renderings of New York and countless other cities, as well as his vibrant and detailed tributes to popular icons such as the New York Yankees, Marilyn Monroe, Elvis Presley, Alfred Hitchcock and the characters of Walt Disney. He has painted 11 Super Bowls for the National Football League, six All-Star Games for Major League Baseball, five Daytime Emmy Award ceremonies, two FIFA World Cup tournaments, the GRAMMY Awards, and is the official artist for the 2009 and 2010 President's Council on Physical Fitness and The President's Challenge.

Through his artwork, Fazzino has raised several million dollars for charitable causes such as Muscular Dystrophy Association, NECO, MS 150 Bike Tour, Alzheimer's Association, Rosie O'Donnell's For All Kids Foundation, and many more.

There have been five art books published about Fazzino's art and career, and his first children's book, Sam Katz: On the Loose was published by Random House in 2005. In 2009, he was a recipient of the Ellis Island Medal of Honor.

Fazzino is a graduate of the New York School of Visual Arts.


